PUBLIC CONSULTATION TO BE HELD IN WOLFFVILLE

The Annapolis Valley Regional Library (AVRL), in conjunction with the Town of Wolfville, will host a public consultation session to begin the conversation about the future needs of library users and how best to incorporate those needs into the Town's Strategic Plan for facilities and service development. The consultation will be held on Saturday, November 4, at the Wolfville Market, from 2:30 – 6 PM. Janet Ness, vice-chair of the AVRL board, says "The Town of Wolfville has been a strong supporter of our vibrant and much loved Wolfville Library for the past twenty-four years. The opportunity to continue to grow as part of the Town's Strategic Plan is further evidence of the value of our library to our community. I hope to see many people join in this conversation, in person or online."

Last year, the Wolfville library loaned more books and other materials than any library in our region. They held more programs and had the largest attendance. At this "World Café" style consultation, we will be asking questions pertaining to the use of library space and the activities that would happen at the library.

Members of the Wolfville community will be invited to offer their opinions on library use, spaces, furnishings, youth areas, and more. For those who wish to offer an opinion but cannot attend on this day, there is an online survey at the library's website at www.valleylibrary.ca.

"The Wolfville library has a large base of support, and we are excited to hear what the community has to say about the possibility of growing this library," said Angela Reynolds, Community Engagement Coordinator for AVRL.
